All shows must follow state fair guidelines

Randolph County Fair Livestock General Rules and Guidelines

- Any changes to the show schedules will be at the discretion of the Randolph County Fair Livestock Superintendent. Changes will only be made if necessary due to extreme or unforeseen circumstances (i.e. severe weather, extreme heat, etc...). Changes will be announced as soon as possible.
- The Randolph County Livestock Show (all species) is open to all Missouri 4-H
 and FFA members in good standing with their respective Club or Chapter.
- In the event an out of county market animal is selected as grand or reserve champions, the livestock judge will rank in county exhibits for the explicit purpose of determining premium sale order.
- Animal ownership and animal age requirements will be in accordance with the current year's Missouri State Fair rules and guidelines.
- Animal health requirements will follow the current year's Missouri State Fair rules, MO Department of Agriculture guidance, as well as directives put forth by the Missouri State Veterinary's Office.
- Any grooming technique or practice deemed to be unsafe, unethical, or dishonest will exclude the exhibitor from competing at the Randolph County Fair. Further punitive action may be necessary dependent upon the severity of the infraction, especially if an animal's well-being is in question.
- Any discrepancies will be addressed by the show chair and livestock superintendent. All decisions made by show chairmen are final.

General Rules

State Rules Regulating 4-H Exhibits

"4-H is an out of school education program. Consequently, articles made in school under the supervision of teachers and on which students receive school credit do not qualify as 4-H project work. This is a duplication of credit for a single effort and to a large extent, prevents 4-H from achieving its full objectives."

Entries will be accepted from qualified Randolph County junior exhibitors, defined as follows:

Any boy or girl who is a member of a Randolph County 4-H Club, enrolled in the project and meets the 4-H eligibility requirements, summarized as follows: Age 8-18. Must have attended at least 6 hours of project meetings in each project. Must be a member in good standing in their respective 4-H club. Must have attended one half of their club meetings. (consult Area Youth Specialist for verification).

Any boy or girl who is a member of a Randolph County FFA Chapter and meets the FFA eligibility requirements summarized as follows: Age 9th grade in high school to the fourth National Convention following high school graduation (approximately 21 years old). Pay annual dues during high school (9th-12th grade). Pay 3-year graduate member package dues at the time of graduation (must have been a FFA member their senior year in high school. Be an active member in good standing in the Randolph FFA Chapter. Have financial and skill development records related to their program in a supervised agriculture record book. (consult Chapter FFA Advisor for verification).

All fair exhibitors are required to wear an unaltered current fair t-shirt during any show or exhibition in which they are participating during the county fair, including the sale.

All classes are to be judged according to the Danish system unless otherwise designated. Each entry is to be classified as blue, red, or white.

Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits; however, the RANDOLPH COUNTY FAIR BOARD WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY LOSSES OR DAMAGES TO THE EXHIBITS. THE RANDOLPH COUNTY FAIR BOARD WILL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ACCIDENTS. The Fair Board asks that there be no smoking in or around the exhibition area.

The show chair of each department will be responsible for assigning space, arranging exhibits and determining final rules for their department. Their decision must be followed.

Decision of the judges shall be final, and awards made according to the entry book signed by show chair and judges.

Grievance Policy – All policy decisions shall be made by the Randolph County Fair Board executive committee.

All exhibits removed prior to release time are subject to premium loss.

Only blue ribbon 4-H exhibits entered at achievement night are eligible to be selected for the State Fair 4-H building.

All achievement night projects exhibited must be made during the current year.

In order to exhibit as a clover kid at the fair, a boy or girl must be 5-7 years of age by January 1 of the current year and be enrolled in 4-H as a clover kid. Clover kids will exhibit for ribbons only. They will not receive premium money or prizes and may not sell animals at the fair or the livestock sale.

Exhibitors must be 8 years old as of January 1 of the current year for premium.

Youth are expected to conduct themselves according to the best traditions of 4-H, FFA, & other Youth organizations. Unsportsmanlike conduct or inappropriate conduct (drinking, stealing, vandalism, or indiscreet behavior) will not be tolerated. Any violation on the part of the exhibitor may result in dismissal of exhibitor from further competition and may also result in loss of ribbons, prizes, points, and or money.

All exhibitors staying overnight must have an adult directly responsible for them present at the fair.


Bikes are not allowed on fairgrounds, unless camping.

Because the primary purpose of the Randolph County Fair is to promote the involvement and social and intellectual development of the youth of Randolph County. "In-County" status is defined as being an active member, in good standing, of one of the youth organizations with approved representation on the Randolph County Fair Board. This includes 4-H clubs and FFA chapters withing Randolph County.

Dogs are not allowed in livestock stalling, fitting, or showing arenas. The only exception is for an exhibitor's personal dog at their own livestock trailer.


